The Judas/Jude of our Epistle is therefore Judah ben Joseph, ben Miryam.

John Calvin thought our author was the "Judas of James" in Lk 6:16. But "Judas of James" (literal Greek text) does not mean "brother of James" (as Calvin supposed); rather it means "son of James" as virtually all translations indicate. NB: "James of Zebedee" (literal Greek text Mk 3:17) does not mean "brother of Zebedee", but "son of Zebedee".

What does the NT tell us about the Judas/Jude, who is author of our epistle?
